## Background summary:

The commission has been petitioned to amend WAC 220-200-100 to remove Douglas Squirrel and Red Squirrel from "other protected wildlife" classification.

## Public involvement process used and what you learned:

Spoke with petitioner who was interested in finding easily accessible and small game hunting opportunities. Spoke with retired WDFW about the "other" protected list; species was not seen as a necessary game species.

### Action requested and/or proposed next steps:

No change to WAC 220-200-100. Work with the petitioner on other hunting opportunities already available.

I am requesting the following change:	Removal of the Douglas squirrel and Red squirrel from the list of protected species.
This change is needed because:	The Douglas squirrel is the most common species of tree squirrel found in Washington State. Along with its cousin the Red squirrel, these two species have a high population and wide distribution collectively covering the entire of our state, as well as Oregon, Idaho, California, the southern Canadian provinces, and eastern states along the Catskill and Appalachian mountain. The two species are improperly identified as protected, which draws funds and protects competing habitat/range from other species (such as the endangered Western Grey Squirrel). They are listed by the IUCN as a "species of least concern", and should not be protected under state law.
■ The effect of this rule change will be:	The Douglas squirrel and Red squirrel would be removed from the list of protected species cited in <u>WAC 220-200-100</u> . Management of the species would be placed under the authority of Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, and management would be performed in a way more appropriate a "species of least concern". Funding and resources formerly used to prote these species would be freed up to be reallocated to other species in Washington more in need.
