
## Purpose & Philosophy

Natural riparian corridors are the most diverse, dynamic, and complex biophysical habitats on the terrestrial portion of the earth.

Our Mandate: To preserve, protect, and perpetuate Washington's fish, wildlife and ecosystems.


Our Values: We value the protection and restoration of healthy, intact, and fully functioning riparian ecosystems statewide.



## Implementation Approach

Our Role as Advisor: Provide guidance informed by science and consistent with our values, about habitat needs of fish and wildlife and the implications of decisions on those resources over time.

- No one-size fits all solution or silver bullet (the role of the habitat biologist)
- Focus on functions; evaluate relative risk for resources
- Does not preclude sound judgement or technical assistance
