History

- GMP is not required by RCW or WAC
- Existing RCW and WAC considerations
 - Game designations
 - Agency mandate
- The initial 2002 GMP
 - WDFW chose to do a 6-year planning cycle
 - Developed Objectives and Strategies
 - 2 supplementals followed
 - Met our needs for 2 decades
 - Established an ecological baseline



WDFW uses the GMP to:

- Assist work planning and establishing and managing process timelines
- Provide harvest management guidelines for informed decision making
- Inform priorities for survey, monitoring and research
- Communicate issues and potential strategies
- Support future budget requests
- Provide guidance but not establish rule or deprive the agency of discretion



We value a process that:

- Provides for staff, public, and Commission input at appropriate levels
- Clearly delineates game species management guidance from policy
- Is informed by science and policy
- Includes a SEPA process
- Builds trust




Recommended Path Forward

- Acknowledge persuasive value of existing GMP will diminish over time
