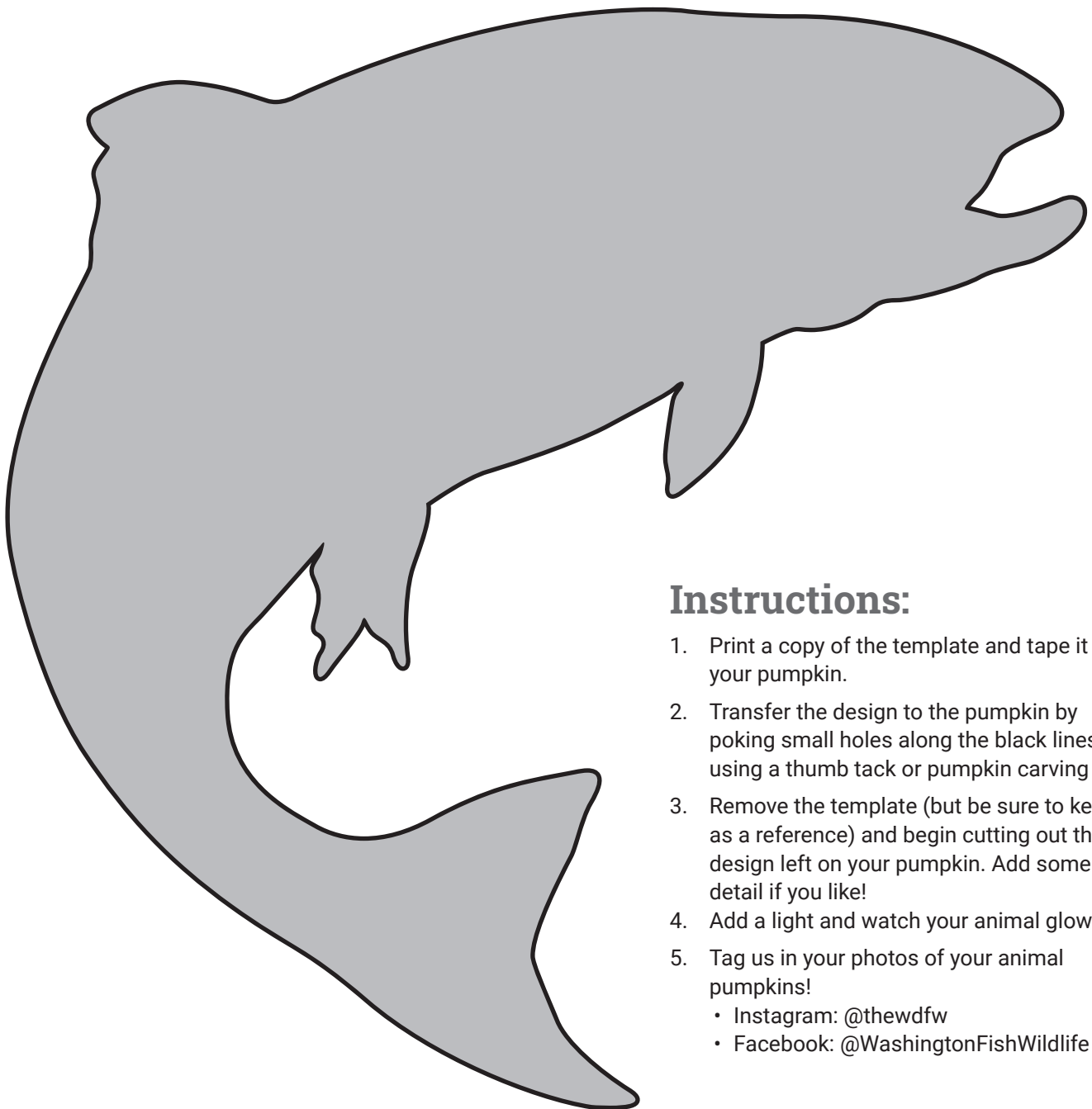
# Wild Washington Salmon Pumpkin Carving Template

## Animal Facts:

### Salmon

Ask any angler when the best time to go fishing is and they will tell you early in the morning or just before sunset. That is because salmon, like many fish, are often most active during the twilight hours around dawn and dusk. There are eight species of salmon found in Washington state.

## Instructions:

1. Print a copy of the template and tape it on your pumpkin.
2. Transfer the design to the pumpkin by poking small holes along the black lines using a thumb tack or pumpkin carving tool.
3. Remove the template (but be sure to keep it as a reference) and begin cutting out the design left on your pumpkin. Add some detail if you like!
4. Add a light and watch your animal glow!
