GMP

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- First GMP SEPA EIS document was completed November 2002
- There have been 2 Supplements to that initial EIS (2009,2015)
- The most recent supplement plan was intended to cover 2015 -2021



- In 2019 The Department decided to extend the plan for 2 years
- This decision was related to multiple issues going on at the time
 - Three-year season setting process
 - Cougar rule revision off cycle




- This was discussed with the Commission in October of 2019
- In August 2020 the Department formally extended timeline of the existing plan
- The 2015 GMP, with the SEPA extension, was in effect until June 30, 2023
- We initiated the plan revision process in the fall of 2021
- We intend to complete the process by December
 2022



- During the revision process (Fall 2021) we determined that a more robust SEPA process may be required
- We started thinking about a new approach to get this project completed with sufficient SEPA review
- Staff continued working on content that included the draft issue statements
- We updated the wildlife committee in March of 2022
- We brought forward a proposed path forward to the Wildlife Committee May 2022

Human Dimensions Surveys

- We have historically conducted a general population and a hunter survey
- The surveys were completed
- These surveys will help in guiding objectives
- The survey results were posted online



- October 2022 the commission gave the department the go ahead with the new approach (individual plans with policy set aside for commission to work on)
- November 2022 Wildlife committee and staff worked on guiding principles for the overarching chapter
- December 2022 Staff presented Issue statements for Migratory Game bird chapter and continued working on principles in the overarching plan



- January 2023 Wildlife Committee proposed new direction related to the GMP
- February 2023 Migratory Game Bird Plan draft was completed and shared with the wildlife committee for review
- March 2023 continued work on overarching plan with the Wildlife Committee. Commission endorsed the outline for the overarching plan.
- April 2023 Identified possible policies that the Wildlife committee could work on

New Commission Direction June 22, 2023 Seattle, WA

The Wildlife Committee Chair made the following recommendations that the Commission endorsed:

- Existing GMP would not be extended when it expires in June 2023
- New GMP should be a single document that would go through a new SEPA process as required;
- Shift priority of conversations at Wildlife Committee from GMP to development of Wildlife Policies;
 - High level updates and review of GMP will still occur at WLC
 - Policy discussion topics were refined to shorter list
- Staff will proceed with 3-year season setting process, at least for those rules that would be invalid otherwise.



Decision Points for Process

- November 2002 Original plan approved by Commission
- 2009 & 2015 Supplements to EIS
 - The most recent supplement plan was intended to cover 2015 –2021
- August 2020 WDFW formally extended timeline
 - The 2015 GMP, with the SEPA extension, was in effect until June 30, 2023
- Fall 2021 WDFW initiated the plan revision process in the fall of 2021
- May 2022 WDFW recommended a new process
- October 2022 Commission gave the department the go ahead
 - Individual plans with policy set aside for commission to work on
- January 2023 Wildlife Committee proposed new direction related to the GMP
 - Single plan with identified policies
- June 2023 Commission endorsed the revised process and revised the proposed Policy topics; Department allowed GMP to expire





New GMP Timelines

Complete writing in two phases. SEPA process commences once writing is completed, Target SEPA completion by Dec 2024.

Chapters targeted for completion by November 2023:

- Overarching Chapter
- Migratory Birds
- White-tailed deer
- Elk
- Predator prey

New GMP Timelines

- November 2023, Share all the Issue statements with the committee for review
- November 2023, Share Overarching, elk and WTD draft chapters, Possible predator prey chapter, based on policy discussion
- Share bear and cougar drafts as soon as they become ready (January 2024?)
- Meanwhile, staff continue writing chapters to meet July deadlines
