Friday, October 27, 2023

1. Call to Order - postponed until Saturday

Chair Baker called the meeting to order at 8:01 a.m. and announced that the meeting minute approval, committee reports and the Director's Report would all be postponed until the end of the meeting to help manage the public testimony. The Commission then took public comments.

2. Open Public Input

5. Fish Passage and Screen Rulemaking - Briefing, Public Hearing

Staff briefed the Commission on draft rule language to create a new Washington Administrative Code (WAC) chapter for WDFW, based on Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 77.57. The 2019-2021 Operating Budget, ESHB 1109, directed WDFW to develop and adopt rules to implement and enforce RCW 77.57, known as the Fishway, Flow, and Screening Statute.

6. Black Bear Timber Damage – Briefing, Public Hearing

Staff briefed the Commission on amendments to WAC 220-440-210; Wildlife management and wildlife interactions, Black bear timber depredation permits and heard comments from the public.

7. Coastal Crab and Puget Sound Shellfish Rulemaking - Decision

Staff briefed the Commission and requested approval on rule proposals for coastal and Puget Sound shellfish.

Commissioner Anderson made a motion to approve the rule proposals submitted by staff, Commissioner Smith seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

8. <u>Petition: Statewide Protection of Resident Forms of Wild Steelhead – Briefing,</u> <u>Decision</u>

Staff briefed the Commission on a petition requesting rulemaking changes to the statewide protection of wild resident steelhead.

Commissioner Anderson made a motion to deny the petition and asked staff to create a policy, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Ragen. All were in favor and the motion passed.

9. Co-manager Hatchery Policy - Decision

Staff asked the Commission for approval to adopt the policy guiding co-management of anadromous salmon and steelhead hatcheries between the state and tribes.

Commissioner Anderson made a motion to approve the policy, Commissioner Parker seconded the motion. The motion passed with a vote of 6 in favor and – 3 against.

10. North of Falcon Policy (C-3608) Briefing, Public Comment

Staffed briefed the Commission on the current North of Falcon Policy which sunsets in December, and outlined the potential modifications needed prior renewal of the new policy in January.

Staff discussed ways the department is exploring science and how it's being used. The Commissioners requested regular updates on this.

13. Gray Squirrel Periodic Status Review - Briefing, Public Hearing

Staff provided a briefing on the status of the Western Gray Squirrel described in the final Periodic Status Review.

14. Petition: Begin Rulemaking to Regulate the State's Management of Endangered Gray Wolves – Briefing, Decision

Staff briefed the Commission on a rulemaking petition to regulate the state's management of Endangered Gray Wolves.

Commissioner Smith made a motion to accept the petition and initiate rulemaking as presented by the petitioners, Commissioner Rowland seconded that motion. After a lengthy discussion Chair Baker called for the vote. 3 Commissioners voted to accept the petition and 6 Commissioners voted against the petition. The motion failed.

After the decision the Commission decided that sometime in the future the Executive Committee will have further discussions about creating an ad-hoc committee to address some of the topics that were in the petition.

• The Commission considered approval of the September 28-30, 2023, meeting minutes.

Commissioner Ragen made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Lehmkuhl, to approve the minutes from the September 28-30, 2023, hybrid meeting in Yakima, as presented. All in favor. Motion passes.

Big Tent Committee

The Committee members in attendance: Baker, Parker, Lehmkuhl, Smith The committee discussed the Best Available Science policy and the edits to the Conservation policy, along with the process moving forward.

Habitat Committee

Committee members in attendance: Linville, Lehmkuhl, Ragen, Myers Staff presented the yearly review of the department's grazing program. They also discussed connectivity and the state's connectivity plan.

Fish Committee

Committee members in attendance: Anderson, Linville, Anderson, Parker
The committee also discussed Coastal Steelhead, Coastal Spring chinook federal petition, the North
of Falcon policy, season planning and the statewide steelhead petition of resident forms of wild
steelhead. They also discussed the next several months and timing of upcoming meetings.

Wildlife Committee

Committee members in attendance: Smith, Anderson, Rowland, Myers
Commissioner Smith shared that the committee spent a fair amount of time going over the season setting process and the option of delegating table one to the Director. After hearing comments from the public some Commissioners considered changing their vote on what they want to recommend. Commissioner Smith clarified that the original recommendation to delegate table one to the Director should stand and if that passes and asked staff to put something out to the public that explains what the delegation means. The recommendation to move table one to the Director for delegation went forward and the motion passed with a 7-2 approval. The Commissioners asked that the Director share any deviations to the delegation with them.

3. Director's Report

The director requested approval for a decision package to cover an improved safety program for the department. The commissioners all supported the request.

15. Meeting Debrief and Future Meeting Planning

The following actions were captured from the meeting.

Commissioners would like to work on how to better handle public comments. Commission Lehmkuhl and Smith will work with Nate on this.

Commissioner Smith asked staff to work on getting the Carnivore Science Panel scheduled after Thanksgiving. Commissioner should send questions to the panel in advance. Black Bear Timber Damage decision will move to the December meeting along with the Bear and Cougar petition.

Barbara and Nate will meet Monday to do a first round of edits to the Conservation Policy.

Special Fish Committee meeting is scheduled for November 30th.

The Commissioners approved the 2024 meeting dates.

Centennial Accord is Monday & Tuesday, Barbara and Kelly will attend.

Chair Baker asked who may want to attend the WAFWA Meeting in Nevada. Commissioner Anderson and Commissioner Linville will attend with Nate.

Chair Baker adjourned the meeting at 3:51 p.m.
