


We ask that your expectations around implementation change, based on what time of year it is.

Staff need time to provide detail and cost ahead of commission approval and the legislative schedule.






Review the graph to better understand when your ideas could come to fruition

As an outcome or problem statement



The commission's budget authority come from the group.

So, the best way to put forward a budget idea is a motion and vote by the commission.



Decision packages have a format:

- Problem statement
- Proposed Solution
- Detail on how the solution will be accomplished
- Cost



You may want to put forward a **problem** statement or an outcome you want to see achieved.

You can also propose a solution or method of going about achieving an outcome.

Staff should return with **details** on how the solution might be accomplished and an **estimate of costs.**



State purchasing rules

When we select vendors, the state requires us to use a **competitive process**.

Request for proposal, bids, etc.

This makes it difficult to give funds to a particular individual or organization.


