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WDOH Shellfish License: To participate in the fishery, harvesters must have authorization to act on behalf of a WDOH certified shellstock shipper, or become certified as an individual shellfish harvester. To harvest for a WDOH certified shellstock shipper, you must have the company's harvest site certificate and shellstock tags with you while harvesting. The company you are working for is responsible for record-keeping and inspections. The company will tell you who to sell your clams to. To obtain a Shellfish Harvester-Razor Clam Only License, you must submit an application, pay the fee of \$616, pass a pre-operational inspection, and get inspected annually. Individual shellfish harvesters must obtain their own shellstock tags and maintain records for review.

For a list of WDOH certified shellstock shippers, contact the Department of Health at (360) 236-3352 or the Department of Fish and Wildlife office at (360) 665-4166. Once you are approved to harvest on behalf of a company, they will submit your name to WDFW. There is no fee to register. If you choose to become certified by WDOH as an individual shellfish harvester, you will be asked to show proof of your license. WDFW will only sell commercial razor clam licenses to individuals whose names appear on a list provided by the company, or who show proof they are certified by WDOH as an individual shellfish harvester. If you apply by mail, your license will not be issued until your name or proof of license has been received. If you plan to purchase a license in person, first call WDFW Licensing at (360) 902-2464 to confirm that WDFW has your name registered.

DNR Right-of-Entry (ROE) authorization: DNR is requiring a Right of Entry authorization for the 2025 commercial razor clam season. For more information on how to acquire, call (360) 870-5678 or visit www.dnr.wa.gov/programs-and-services/aquatics/shellfish/razor-clams.

WDOH Shellstock Tags: Razor clams must be tagged with the appropriate DOH shellstock tag provided by the company you are authorized to dig for according to DOH harvest rules, in accordance with WAC 246-282-080.2. Untagged buckets of clams are subject to seizure. Transport Tickets: If you intend to sell clams anywhere other than the point of landing, a transport ticket must be filled out and kept with the clams until the point of sale. Transport tickets are available through WDFW Commercial Licensing at (360) 902-2464, Option 4.
