Purpose

Background

All three SILs (Habitat, Stormwater, and Shellfish) are interested in engaging the agricultural community to inform our work, such as updating Implementation Strategies and the Action Agenda, and identifying investment priorities and policy barriers to achieving shared goals. Agriculture is economically and culturally important to the Puget Sound. The agricultural community has a vital role in Puget Sound recovery as land stewards, economic engines, and important partners in floodplain management.

The HSIL IS Leads (Land Development and Cover, Floodplains and Estuaries) are weighing different options on how to engage with the agricultural community to build strong relationships, advance the strategies, and accelerate Puget Sound recovery. We want to draw on the expertise of the HSIAT in community engagement and agriculture to inform our approach for engaging with the agricultural community and better incorporating their interests into our work to achieve habitat protection and restoration.
