


#### **Current PS Rec Seasons**

  - Next ISU scheduled for Friday



## **PSRFEF Budget History Revisited**

## **PSRFEF Budget History**

- 2003 PSRFE established by legislature.
- 2003 2011- funded by \$10 surcharge.
- 2009 Great recession, GF-S reductions at various PS hatchery programs. Dedicated WL-S funds (like PSRFEF) diverted to prevent hatchery closures.
- 2010 Audit evaluated and shifted investment strategy away from focus on blackmouth and yearling programs to more comprehensive recreational fisheries enhancement.
- 2011 PS enhancement fund surcharge goes away, when base hunting and fishing license fees are raised by 10%.
- 2011 today dedicated fund survey determines funding level for PSRFEF, Warmwater Account, etc.

## **Current Budget Availability**

- \$105k rollover from last biennium
- + \$30k from Glenwood production as of June 2022
- Current investments for marking and tagging and goals and development total \$224,900/year
- ~\$130k to use

## Glenwood Springs

- Hatchery production supported by LLTK and other groups (including PSRFEF)
- Currently: \$60,000 / biennium for production
- Low returns from Glenwood in PS recreational fisheries (less than 10% of adults caught in PS)
- Funding reduced last biennium, after recommendations to phase out in 2018
- Funding discontinued as of June 2022



#### Oak Harbor Net Pens

- History
  - Oak Harbor Net Pens were used from 1982 – 2010
  - 2009 2011: statewide budget restraint on hatchery production first cut funding from educational /outreach projects
  - Discontinued in 2011 due to funding
