

Marijuana Eradication Contract with the Washington State Patrol

- Receive \$25,000 for:
 - Fund overtime patrols
 - Purchase specialized equipment
 - Fuel cost reimbursement





Marijuana Eradication Contract with the Washington State Patrol

- Efforts to protect crops have resulted in a threat to public safety
- The negative environmental impact resulting from these gardens is a major concern





Boating Safety Enforcement

- Receive \$100,000 a year from State Parks for:
 - Fund ½ an FTE officer position
 - Purchase equipment
 - Training



Boating Safety Enforcement

- Conduct boating safety checks, focused on hunters anglers
- Respond to emergency situations
- BUI patrols





Boating Safety Enforcement


- Promote boating safety through outreach and education

Ephrata Security Patrols with the Bureau of Reclamation

- Receive \$40,000 for:
 - Fund ½ an FTE officer position
 - Reimburse vehicle costs
 - Purchase equipment





Ephrata Security Patrols with the Bureau of Reclamation

- Officers patrol the Columbia Basin region providing security, protecting natural resources, and enforcing public safety regulations
- The Columbia Basin Project consists of 1.2 million acres
 - 671,000 acres is irrigated, while the remainder is managed primarily as wildlife habitat and for recreation
- Officers are required to:
 - check local irrigation systems and facilities
 - respond to emergent situations
 - conduct investigations involving both criminal and civil violations,
 - engage in public and educational outreach programs

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Law Enforcement Services Contract

- Receive \$20,750 for:
 - Fund overtime patrols
 - Reimburse vehicle costs
 - Equipment purchases





U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Law Enforcement Services Contract

 WDFW provides the contractor with Enforcement patrols to prevent

Trespassing

- Timber theft
- Vandalism
- Traffic violations
- Poaching



Lewis River Law Enforcement Contract with PacifiCorp

- Receive \$565,000, for a five-year contract, to:
 - Fund an FTE officer position
 - Reimburse vehicle costs
 - Purchase equipment
- WDFW provides the contractor with Patrols at PacifiCorp's:
 - Public access sites
 - Project lands and vicinity
 - Reservoirs and associated boat-in recreation sites

Eastern Washington U.S. Bureau of Land Management Contract

Receive \$40,000 to:

- Fund overtime patrols
- Reimburse vehicle/fuel costs
- Purchase equipment

WDFW Provides contractor with:

 law enforcement patrols on public lands, waters, roads, and trails administered by the BLM in the eastern two thirds of Washington State.



2011-13 Enforcement Program Budget




2011-13 Enforcement Program Budget
