List conflicting law or rule if known:

- WAC 220-660-300(6) needs to be repealed.
- WAC 220-660-300(6) conflicts with WAC 352-37-340 by adding additional and unsubstantiated rules and requirements for beach mining. WAC 220-660-300(6) includes language about moving beach driftwood and site excavation requirements that are different than WAC 352-37-340.
- WAC 220-660-300(6) conflicts with RCW 34.05 at least minimally in the following ways:
 - There is a lack of coordination between beach mining rules in WAC 220-660-300(6) and with State Parks and Recreation beach mining rules in WAC 352-37-340.
 - There has not been any effort to reach an agreement among interested parties (small scale miners) before the publication of the notice and adoption of the proposed rule.
- WAC 220-660-300(6) is poorly written because it conflicts with existing beach mining HPAs that have been approved for the same time window and same locations.
