Background summary:

The Puget Sound shrimp fishery policy (Policy C3610) was reviewed and a revised policy was adopted by the Commission on December 15, 2012. The policy stipulates a Department annual report to the Commission describing the performance of Puget Sound shrimp fisheries. This briefing will summarize for each management region the performance and harvest of both commercial and recreational fisheries during the 2017 season.

The shrimp fishery is very popular and the spot shrimp allocation objective in Puget Sound is 70% recreational and 30% commercial. Commercial harvest is structured to take quota in northern Puget Sound. The commercial shrimp fisheries have been limited entry since 2001, with a total of 5 trawl licenses and 18 pot licenses. Non-spot shrimp commercial landings exceeded 60,000 pounds in 2017. Commercial spot shrimp harvest has been over 100,000 pounds in recent years with an ex-vessel value of about \$954 thousand in 2017. The recreational spot shrimp fishery landings are on an increasing trend, exceeding 204,000 pounds in 2017.
