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Delegation of Authority – Blue Sheet Response

May 4th. 2018

Purpose: Consider further delegation of authority to the Director as a way to streamline

Commission meeting agendas and maximize Commission meeting time on the highest

agency priorities.

Action 1: Under existing delegated authority, allow the Director and staff to resolve issues

outside of the Commission meeting and report outcome to the Commission as

necessary.

Examples: a) Periodic species status reviews when there is no recommended change in status

b) General orientation briefings by agency programs conducted via written reports (enforcement, website development, lean) unless requested via "Blue Sheet" process

c) One general public input opportunity per meeting day

d) Approval of individual or three year hunting/fishing package components by the

Director via an expedited rule process

e) Puget Sound clam and oyster seasons

f) Use of a consent calendar process

Action 2: Provide additional delegation authority to the Director so issues can be resolved

outside of regular Commission meetings.

Examples: a) Approval of timber sales less than or equal to 1,000,000 board feet for areas not

under an approved management plan

b) Approval of land leases, concessions, easements or licenses, crop share

agreements, selling agricultural commodities, and land use agreements deemed

appropriate under local land use requirements

3) Approval of minor rule changes required by legislation (PDR costs) or an agreed

court order (HPA rule making and mineral prospecting)
