Purpose: The purpose of this rule is to close fox trapping within the exterior boundaries of the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie, Okanogan, Wenatchee, and Gifford Pinchot National forests to prevent accidental take of state endangered Cascade red fox.

EMERGENCY RULE

Reasons for this finding: This rule is necessary to protect Cascade red fox population which is listed as an endangered species in Washington State. NEW SECTION

WAC 220-417-01000B Trapping seasons and regulations.

Effective immediately, through March 31, 2024, the provisions of WAC 220-417-010 regarding trapping seasons for fox shall be modified as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-417-010 not addressed herein remain in effect unless otherwise amended by emergency rule:

Fox trapping is CLOSED within the exterior boundaries of the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie, Okanogan, Wenatchee, and Gifford Pinchot National forests. Effective immediately.
