NEW SECTION

WAC 220-312-04000Y Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound.

Effective October 9 through October 31, 2024, the following provisions of WAC 220-312-040 recreational fishing seasons for the Cascade River, shall be as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-312-040 not addressed herein, or unless otherwise amended, remain in effect:

Cascade River (Skagit Co.); from mouth to Rockport-Cascade Rd. Bridge:

Gamefish and salmon open daily, October 9 through October 31:

- (a) Anti-snagging rules.
- (b) Night closure.
- (c) Salmon: Daily limit 4 coho. Release all other salmon.
- (d) Game fish: Statewide length/daily limit, except:
 - (i) Cutthroat trout and wild rainbow trout: Minimum length 14 inches.
 - (ii) Dolly Varden/bull trout: Minimum length of 20 inches, count as part of the trout daily limit.
