NEW SECTION

WAC 220-417-01000C Trapping seasons and regulations.

Effective immediately, until further notice, the provisions of WAC 220-417-010 regarding trapping seasons for fox shall be modified as described below. All other provisions of WAC 220-417-010 not addressed herein remain in effect unless otherwise amended by emergency rule:

Fox trapping is CLOSED within the exterior boundaries of the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie, Okanogan, Wenatchee, and Gifford Pinchot National forests.
