



NON-FATAL INCIDENTS

1. SHOOTER: 39 year-old male VICTIM: 39 year-old male

FIREARM: 12 gauge shotgun TYPE: Non-fatal COUNTY: Spokane BLAZE ORANGE: Yes

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Yes DATE OF INCIDENT: 10/25/08

NARRATIVE: The shooter and victim were hunting pheasants about 35

yards apart when a bird flushed between them. The shooter fired, striking the victim in the legs, shoulder, face and eye. The victim was silhouetted by a willow tree and

high grass and not easily visible to the shooter.

CAUSE: Victim covered by shooter swinging on game

2. SHOOTER: 47 year-old male VICTIM: Self-inflicted FIREARM: .50 muzzleloading rifle TYPE: Non-fatal COUNTY: Pacific BLAZE ORANGE: N/A

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Yes DATE OF INCIDENT: 12/31/08

NARRATIVE: The shooter returned to camp from a muzzleloading hunt and

was putting his rifle on the top bunk in his camper when the gun discharged through his right hand. The shooter failed to remove the percussion cap before putting his firearm away and the safety

was in the "off" position when the rifle discharged.

CAUSE: Careless handling

3. SHOOTER: 57 year-old male VICTIM: 55 year-old male

FIREARM: 12 gauge shotgun TYPE: Non-fatal COUNTY: Franklin BLAZE ORANGE: N/A

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Yes DATE OF INCIDENT: 11/7/08

NARRATIVE: The shooter was a waterfowl guide who, along with his client, was

looking for crippled birds. The victim was about 50 yards away and obscured by a Russian olive tree when the shooter fired at a cripple on the water, striking the victim with one ricochet pellet

in the face.

CAUSE: Victim out of sight of shooter / ricochet

4. SHOOTER: 14 year-old male VICTIM: 54 year-old female

FIREARM: .270 rifle TYPE: Fatal

COUNTY: Skagit BLAZE ORANGE: N/A

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Yes DATE OF INCIDENT: 8/2/08

NARRATIVE: The shooter and his 16 year-old brother were hunting along a

hiking trail during intermittent fog and observed movement below them about 80 yards away. The shooter thought it was a bear and fired, striking a hiker in the head and killing her instantly. The shooter was tried and convicted of second degree

manslaughter.

CAUSE: Victim mistaken for game

5. SHOOTER: 28 year-old male VICTIM: 36 year-old male

FIREARM: .270 rifle TYPE: Fatal COUNTY: Chelan BLAZE ORANGE: N/A

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Yes DATE OF INCIDENT: 10/12/08

NARRATIVE: The shooter and a hunting companion were dropped off by the

victim. They planned to hunt downhill and rendezvous later with the victim (who served as the vehicle driver). When the shooter approached the vehicle he began unloading and his rifle discharged, striking the victim inside the vehicle 25 yards away.

CAUSE: Careless handling while unloading (safety was off)

6. SHOOTER: 56 year-old male VICTIM: Self-inflicted

FIREARM: 12-gauge shotgun TYPE: Fatal

COUNTY: Benton BLAZE ORANGE: N/A

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Unknown DATE OF INCIDENT: 10/19/08

NARRATIVE:

A solo waterfowl hunter did not return home as expected, triggering a search. The hunter was found dead with a single gunshot wound to the chest. The wound was self-inflicted and

appeared to be incidental.

CAUSE: Careless handling

7. SHOOTER: Unknown shooter VICTIM: 30 year-old male

FIREARM: Unknown rifle TYPE: Fatal COUNTY: Skamania BLAZE ORANGE: No

HUNTER ED GRADUATE: Unknown DATE OF INCIDENT: 11/1/2008

NARRATIVE:

This incident took place during a November elk season. The victim was picking bear grass by himself when an unknown shooter fired a single shot, striking and killing the bear grass picker. The sheriff's office has identified a possible shooter in this incident, which is still under investigation. No determination has been made yet by the sheriff's office whether this was a hunting incident.

CAUSE: Under investigation: Possibly a case of victim mistaken for game
