

# Sport Fishing Rules Pamphlet Corrections

May 1, 2012 through April 30, 2013

## Westside Rivers (Updated March 27, 2013)

P. 58 Toutle River, South Fork (Lewis Co.) The selective gear and internal combustion motor prohibited rules are incorrectly listed for this section from mouth to 4100 Rd. Bridge. The correct gear restrictions ended March 15 when the All Game Fish season ended.

## Coastal Rivers (Updated June 5, 2012)

P. 29 Chehalis River (Grays Harbor/Thurston/Lewis counties) The selective gear rules requirement is incorrect for these sections:

- From mouth to Highway 6 Bridge in town of Adna
- From Highway 6 Bridge in town of Adna to high bridge on Weyerhaeuser 1000 line approximately 400 yards downstream from Roger Creek.

The correction to this rule is the removal of the selective gear rule requirement for these sections.

P.30 Wynoochee River (Grays Harbor/ Jefferson counties) The selective gear rules requirement is incorrect for the section from WDFW White Bridge Access Site to 7400 Line Bridge above mouth of Schafer Creek.

The correction to this rule is the removal of the selective gear rule requirement for this section.

P.30 Wynoochee River (Grays Harbor/ Jefferson counties) The section from WDFW White Bridge Access Site to 7400 Line Bridge above mouth of Schafer Creek is missing “All Species” regulations.

The correction is that this regulation should read “All species –August 16 through November 30: single-point barbless hooks required. September 16 through November 30: bait prohibited.”

P.31 Blooms Ditch and Salmon Creek (Thurston County) The fishing area for these waters are missing.

The correction is that the fishing areas for Blooms Ditch and Salmon Creek should read “from mouth to I-5.”

### **Eastside Lakes** [\(Updated June 1, 2012\)](#)

P. 92 Northwestern Reservoir (Klickitat/ Skamania counties) This entry is incorrect. The correction is that Northwestern Reservoir should be removed from the pamphlet because it no longer exists.

### **Eastside Rivers** [\(Updated June 6, 2012\)](#)

P. 78 Mill Creek (Walla Walla County) The All Species regulations incorrectly list a season from September 1 through October 31.

The correction is that the All Species regulations are year-round. The regulation should read “All species –Barbless hooks required. Selective gear rules. Internal combustion motors prohibited.”

### **Puget Sound and Strait Rivers** [\(Updated September 13, 2012\)](#)

P. 43 Skykomish River (Snohomish County) The section from Gold Bar/ Big Eddy Access (Highway 2 Bridge) to confluence of North and South forks has an incorrect start date for fishing from any floating device prohibited from 1,000 feet downstream of the Reiter Ponds outlet to 1,500 feet upstream.

The correction is that the regulation should state, “All Species --**June 1** through February 15, fishing from a floating device is prohibited from 1000 feet downstream of Reiter Ponds outlet to 1500 feet upstream.

P.46 Carbon River (Pierce Co.) From the mouth to Voights Creek, there is a season overlap for Other Game Fish and All Game Fish that results in conflicting rules for daily bag limits and minimum size. The All Game Fish rule is listed correctly. The correct season for Other Game Fish is Sept. 1 through Nov. 30.

P. 46 White (Stuck) River (Pierce County) The section from R Street Bridge to Highway 410 Bridge at Buckley does not state that there is a closed waters section.

The correction is that the following regulation should be added to this section, “Closed waters: Puget Power canal, including the screen bypass channel, above the screen at Dingle Basin.”

P.47 Nisqually River (Pierce County) The internal combustion motors prohibited requirement for the section from Alder Reservoir upstream including Little Nisqually, Mineral Creek, and north fork Mineral Creek, and all other tributaries of Alder Reservoir is incorrect.

The correction to this rule is the removal of the internal combustion motors prohibited requirement for this section.

P. 50 Skokomish River (Mason County) The section from the mouth to Highway 106 Bridge incorrectly allows retention of chum from September 16 through September 30.

The correction is that the regulation should state “Release chum.”

**Westside Lakes** (Updated August 22, 2012)

Pioneer Ponds (tributary to Stillaguamish River) (Snohomish County) is not listed in the pamphlet. Their location is in the City of Arlington adjacent the Stillaguamish Valley Pioneer Museum, 20722 67th Ave NE.

The correction is that Pioneer Pond is closed waters.
