



NON-FATAL INCIDENT

Cause: Careless handling, victim in line of fire

Victim was hiking on an old game trail while elk hunting. After losing his footing and falling, the victim used his rifle as a crutch to help him get off the ground. As he was standing the rifle discharged striking him in the left forearm. The victim was able to apply a tourniquet to the wound, likely preventing this from becoming a fatal incident. Due to the remote location of the incident it was over three hours before the victim received additional first aid. The injury resulted in the eventual amputation of his left hand.

Victim was hunting deer from a tree-stand near an abandoned logging road. The victim called 911 to report that he had fallen from the tree stand and was in need of medical assistance. Officers located the victim and provided first aid, but the victim succumbed to his injuries prior to reaching the hospital. A search of the area found that one screw-in pegs had pulled free from the tree. Officers were unable to determine if the victim fell from the tree stand or fell while climbing into the stand.

- Treat all firearms as if they are loaded and always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction.
- Be sure of your target and what is beyond it.
- Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to fire.
- Never carry or place a loaded firearm in or on a motor vehicle.
- Never use a firearm that you are unfamiliar with.
- Never use a firearm (that is not yours) without the owner's permission.
- Be sure the action and barrel are clear of obstructions.
- Never cross a fence, stream, or obstacle with a loaded firearm.
- Never point a firearm at anything you do not want to shoot.
- Unload firearms when not in use and store ammunition in a separate place away from firearm.
- Never use alcohol or drugs before or during shooting.
